# ANNUAL FEES PAYABLE TO THE SOUTH AFRICAN COUNCIL FOR SOCIAL SERVICE PROFESSIONS (SACSSP): 2022/2023

- 1. The South African Council for Social Service Professions (SACSSP) herewith informs all registered social workers, social auxiliary workers, student social workers, student social auxiliary workers, child and youth care workers, auxiliary child and youth care workers, student child and youth care workers and student auxiliary child and youth care workers that the fees payable to the SACSSP for 2022/2023 has been approved and published in *Government Notice R 1512 of 19 November 2021* (Government Gazette No 45501 of 19 November 2021). The *Fees payable by social workers, child and youth care workers, social auxiliary workers, auxiliary child and youth care workers, student social worker and student child and youth care worker amendment Regulations* can be downloaded <a href="here">here</a>. All registered social service professionals and those who will be registered for the first time in 2022 are encouraged to study these Regulations thoroughly. These Regulations take immediate effect.
- 2. Annual fees payable to the SACSSP by social workers, social auxiliary workers, child and youth care workers and auxiliary child and youth care workers already registered are payable by 02 January 2022 and not later than 31 March 2022. Registrants are encouraged to pay the prescribed fees, especially annual fees, timely and not to wait until the last few days before the due date of 31 March to make payments. The latter tends to cause significant bottleneck, which results in delays in the issuing of receipts.
- 3. Registration fees by persons registering for the <u>first time</u> with SACSSP as a social worker, social auxiliary worker, child and youth care worker or auxiliary child and youth care worker are payable with the accompanying registration forms, supporting documents and proof of payment of the registration fee and annual fee by 31 March 2022.
- 4. For ease of reference, the fees as published in the Regulations are set out below per professional group and registration category.

**Note:** In the case of a late payment of an annual fee payable as a social worker and for a speciality in social work, the fine will be calculated per annual fee due as per regulations 2(a)(ix) and 2(b)(vii), i.e.  $R456 \times 2$ .

### 4.5 ALL STUDENTS

- 4.5.1 Registration fees and related fees for students as indicated below are payable as follows:
- 4.5.1.1 Students studying social work:
  - (a) who are in their second year of study need to pay the required registration fee by 31 March 2022 as to be registered as *student social worker*, and
  - (b) who have not registered with the SACSSP in their second year of study, irrespective of their current year of study, needs to rectify the requirement to be registered, and pay the required registration fee by 31 March 2022 as to be registered as student social worker.

#### 4.5.1.2 Students studying social auxiliary work:

- (a) needs to pay the required registration fee in their first year of study by 31 March 2022 as to be registered as *student social worker*;
- (b) needs to pay the required registration fee within three months after the date of commencement of the first year of their studies if that date is after 31 March 2022 as to be registered as *student social auxiliary worker*; and
- (c) who have not registered with the SACSSP in their first year of study, irrespective of their current year of study, needs to rectify the requirement to be registered, and pay the required registration fee by 31 March 2022 as to be registered as *student social auxiliary worker*

### 4.5.1.3 Students studying child and youth care work (professional level):

- (a) needs to pay the required registration fee in their first year of study by 31 March 2022 as to be registered as *student child and youth care worker*, and
- (b) who have not registered with the SACSSP in their first year of study, irrespective of their current year of study, needs to rectify the requirement to be registered, and pay the required registration fee by 31 March 2022 as to be registered as *student child and youth care worker*.

## 4.5.1.4 Students studying child and youth care work (auxiliary level):

- (a) need to pay the required registration fee in their first year of study by 31 March 2022 as to be registered as *student auxiliary child and youth care worker*;
- (b) need to pay the required registration fee within three months after the date of commencement of the first year of their studies if that date is after 31 March 2022 as to be registered as *student auxiliary child and youth care worker*; and
- (c) who have not registered with the SACSSP in their first year of study, irrespective of their current year of study, needs to rectify the requirement to be registered, and pay the required registration fee by 31 March 2022 as to be registered as student auxiliary child and youth care worker.
- 4.5.2 Training institutions responsible for the training and education of students towards a qualifications in social work, child and youth care work, social auxiliary work and/or auxiliary child and youth care work need to inform such students of the requirement to be registered with the SACSSP as per the Social Service Professions Act 110 of 1978 and the Regulations thereto and monitor the timely registration of such students.

## 5. EXEMPTION FROM ANNUAL FEES

5.1 Certain categories of persons, subject to the conditions as set out in regulation 3 of the Regulations, may apply for exemption or partial exemption from the payment of annual fees. Applications for such exemption must be done in writing using the form as indicated and much reach the SACSSP by 2 January and not later than 15 February 2022. Applications received after 15 February 2022 will not be considered for the financial year starting on 1 April 2022 and full annual fees will be payable for that financial year. The following registered social service professionals may apply for exemption or partial exemption:

# 5.2 Regulation 3(a): A registered professional who has attained the age of 65 years before or on 2 January 2022

- 5.2.1 A social service professional registered with the SACSSP who has attained the age of 65 years on the 2<sup>nd</sup> January 2022 and who is not full-time employed or continue to be full-time employed may apply of the *Regulations relating to the fees payable by social workers, child and youth care workers, social auxiliary workers, auxiliary child and youth care workers, student social workers and student child and youth care workers (Government Notice No. R. 15121 published in Government Gazette No 45501 of 19 November 2021) (the Regulations) to be exempted from the payment of annual fees for the following financial year (starting on 1 April 2022).*
- 5.2.2 Applications for the exemption from the payment of annual fees in terms of regulation 3(a) must reach the SACSSP by 2 January 2022 and not later than 15 February 2022 in the form of FORM

- RR.4 (available on <a href="www.sacssp.co.za">www.sacssp.co.za</a> under Forms Other). Applications received after 15 February 2022 will not be considered for the financial year starting on 1 April 2022 and full annual fees will be payable for that financial year as per the Regulations.
- 5.2.3 For the purpose of regulation 3(a) "full-time employment" (including full-time practice) means full-time employment as defined in section 198C of the Labour Relations Amendment Act 66 of 1995 and "exemption" means that no annual fee is payable by the person exempted.
- 5.2.4 Exemption from the payment of annual fees in terms of regulation 3(a) will only be considered if the annual fees for previous years were paid, unless such a person was already exempted in terms of regulation 3(a), and an exemption will not be applied retrospectively.
- 5.2.5 Applicants need to read instructions and Declaration in FORM RR.4 carefully before completion and submission.

# 5.3 Regulation 3(b): A registered professional who does not practice the profession because of health reasons

- 5.3.1 A social service professional registered with the SACSSP may apply in terms of regulation 3(b) of the Regulations relating to the fees payable by social workers, child and youth care workers, social auxiliary workers, auxiliary child and youth care workers, student social workers and student child and youth care workers (Government Notice No. R. 1512 published in Government Gazette No 45501 of 19 November 2021) (the Regulations) to be partially exempted from the payment of annual fees for the following financial year (starting on 1 April 2022) for health reasons.
- 5.3.2 Applications for the partial exemption from the payment of annual fees in terms of regulation 3(b) must reach the SACSSP by 2 January 2022 and not later than 15 February 2022 in the form of FORM RR.5A (available on <a href="www.sacssp.co.za">www.sacssp.co.za</a> under Forms Other). Applications received after 15 February 2022 will not be considered for the financial year starting on 1 April 2022 and full annual fees will be payable for that financial year as per the Regulations.
- 5.3.3 Partial exemption from the payment of annual fees in terms of regulation 3(b) will only be considered if the annual fees for previous years were paid and will not be applied retrospectively.
- An applicant will be informed in writing no later than 15 March 2022 whether a partial exemption for the payment of annual fees in terms of regulation 3(b) was granted whereafter he or she needs to pay the partial portion of the annual fee no later than 31 March 2022. The full annual fee as per the Regulations remains payable until such notice is received.
- 5.3.5 Applicants need to read instructions and *Declaration* in FORM RR.5A carefully before completion and submission.

# 5.4 Regulation 3(b): A registered professional who has been unemployed for a period of three consecutive months or longer

A social service professional registered with the SACSSP may apply in terms of regulation 3(b) of the Regulations relating to the fees payable by social workers, child and youth care workers, social auxiliary workers, auxiliary child and youth care workers, student social workers and student child and youth care workers (Government Notice No. R. 1512 published in Government Gazette No 45501 of 19 November 2021) (the Regulations) to be partially exempted from the payment of annual fees for the following financial year (starting on 1 April 2022) if he or she is

- unemployed and has no form of income, and was unemployed for three (3) consecutive months or longer on the date of such an application, subject to the submission of written proof.
- For the purpose of regulation 3(b) "unemployed" means a person registered with the SACSSP who is employable and who (i) is not full-time or part-time employed as a social service professional or otherwise; (ii) does not have any form of income; (iii) who is actively seeking employment as a social service professional but is unable to find such employment; and (iv) was unemployed for three (3) consecutive months or longer on the date of this application.
- 5.4.3 Applications for the partial exemption from the payment of annual fees in terms of regulation 3(b) must reach the SACSSP by 2 January 2022 and not later than 15 February 2022 in the form of FORM RR.5B (available on <a href="www.sacssp.co.za">www.sacssp.co.za</a> under Forms Other). Applications received after 15 February 2022 will not be considered for the financial year starting on 1 April 2022 and full annual fees will be payable for that financial year as per the Regulations.
- 5.4.4 Partial exemption from the payment of annual fees in terms of regulation 3(b) will only be considered if the annual fees for previous years were paid and will not be applied retrospectively.
- An applicant will be informed in writing no later than 15 March 2022 whether a partial exemption for the payment of annual fees in terms of regulation 3(b) was granted whereafter he or she needs to pay the partial portion of the annual fee no later than 31 March 2022. The full annual fee as per the Regulations remains payable until such notice is received.
- 5.4.6 Applicants need to read instructions and *Declaration* in FORM RR.5B carefully before completion and submission.
- 5.5 Regulation 3(b): A registered professional who is not practising his or her profession but wishes to remain registered with the SACSSP
- 5.5.1 A social service professional registered with the SACSSP may apply in terms of regulation 3(c) of the Regulations relating to the fees payable by social workers, child and youth care workers, social auxiliary workers, auxiliary child and youth care workers, student social workers and student child and youth care workers (Government Notice No. R. 1512 published in Government Gazette No 45501 of 19 November 2021) (the Regulations) to be partially exempted from the payment of annual fees for the following financial year (starting on 1 April 2022) if he or she is not practising the profession he or she is registered for in any form, including in a voluntary, part-time, ad hoc, advisory, managerial or similar capacity.
- 5.5.2 Applications for the partial exemption from the payment of annual fees in terms of regulation 3(c) must reach the SACSSP by 2 January 2022 and not later than 15 February 2022 in the form of FORM RR.5C (available on <a href="https://www.sacssp.co.za">www.sacssp.co.za</a> under Forms Other). Applications received after 15 February 2022 will not be considered for the financial year starting on 1 April 2022 and full annual fees will be payable for that financial year as per the Regulations.
- 5.5.3 Partial exemption from the payment of annual fees in terms of regulation 3(c) will only be considered if the annual fees for previous years were paid and will not be applied retrospectively.
- An applicant will be informed in writing no later than 15 March 2022 whether a partial exemption for the payment of annual fees in terms of regulation 3(c) was granted whereafter he or she needs to pay the partial portion of the annual fee no later than 31 March 2022. The full annual fee as per the Regulations remains payable until such notice is received.

5.5.5 Applicants need to read instructions and *Declaration* in FORM RR.5C carefully before completion and submission.

- 6.4.1.2 For *child and youth care workers* and *auxiliary child and youth care workers* registering for the **FIRST time** with the SACSSP must use the following <u>Deposit Reference Number</u> when a payment is made:
  - (a) For child and youth care workers (professional category of registration): The SACSSP registration number starting with <u>20-</u> number obtained when one was registered as a student.
  - (b) For child and youth care workers (auxiliary category of registration): The SACSSP registration number starting with <u>80-</u> number obtained when one was registered as a student
- 6.4.1.3 For *students* registering with the SACSSP:
  - (a) For students in social work and social auxiliary work registering for the FIRST time with SACSSP: Use the following <u>Deposit Reference Number</u> when a payment is made: <u>60-</u> plus the first 5 numbers of Identity Number (ID) For example, if your ID number is 980505 5482 082, the reference number will be <u>60-</u>98050.
  - (b) For students in child and youth care worker (professional or auxiliary levels) registering for the FIRST time with the SACSSP: Use the following <u>Deposit Reference Number</u> when a

payment is made: <u>18-</u> plus the first 5 numbers of Identity Number (ID). For example, if your ID number is 980505 5482 082, the reference number will be **18-**98050.

#### 6.4.2 For annual and other fees
