The Association of South African Social Work Education Institutions (ASASWEI) hosted in association with the Department of Social Work (University of Zululand), Association for the Schools of Social Work in Africa (ASSWA), International Association of Schools of Social Work (IASSW), South African Council for Social Service Professions (SACSSP), South African Student Social Workers Association (SASSWA) and National Department of Social Development (DSD), the first online International Social Work Conference from 1 to 3 September 2021 under the theme "Pandemics, poverty and inequality: Social work in the 21st century". The Minister of Social Development, Honourable Ms Lindiwe Zulu, delivered a special message at the Conference during the opening.

The Registrar, Ms Malamba, gave a presentation in the one of the four Conference workshops themed Concerns on social work graduate unemployment, where she proposed possible solutions to mitigate the unemployment faced by newly qualified graduates.
