HAVE YOU RENEWED YOUR LICENCE TO PRACTICE

Social service professionals have an ethical obligation and legal responsibility in terms of the Social Service Professions Act 110 of 1978 to register and remain registered through payment of their annual fees on time. If you are a social service professional registered with the South African Council for Social Service Professions, you have two months left to pay your 2022/23 annual fees (*to renew your licence to continue practicing your profession*).

Annual fees are payable to Council by 2 January until **31 March 2022** to remain registered. Failure to pay by 31 March 2022 will result in deregistration, and you will incur additional costs to the original annual fee payable, in order to restore your name on the Register. Below are annual fees payable by 31 March 2022 for financial year 2022/23, according to designations.

Professional category	Annual fee
Social workers	R466.00
Social auxiliary workers	R233.00
Child and youth care workers	R466.00
Auxiliary child and youth care workers	R233.00
Specialities in social work (in addition to annual fees)	R466.00
